

This year is the birth centenary year of one of the world known Quality Gurus, Professor Kaoru Ishikawa. He was born on 13th July 1915 in Tokyo Japan.

He graduated with engineering degree in Applied Chemistry from University of Tokyo in 1939. He worked as naval technical officer and at Nissan Liquid Fuel Company.

In 1949 he joined the Quality Control Research Group (QCRG) established by Japanese Union of Scientist and engineers (JUSE). After World War II when Japan was in the process of transforming its industrial sector, it was his skill at mobilizing large groups of people towards a specific common goal that was largely responsible for Japan's quality improvement initiative.

He was the one who developed the Ishikawa Diagram (Known also as Cause and Effect or Fish Bone Diagram) used to analyze the industrial process and determine the root cause.

He started the "Quality Circle Activity" to solve problems in much simplified manner through participation of all the related people. He has written two books on Quality Circle besides number of other books on quality.
